This biscuit has been all the way down to the South Pole and back! Who took it there? What kind of biscuit would you bring to the South Pole?



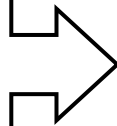
*What is a penguin's favorite biscuit?

Walk across the entrance to the Welcome Gallery

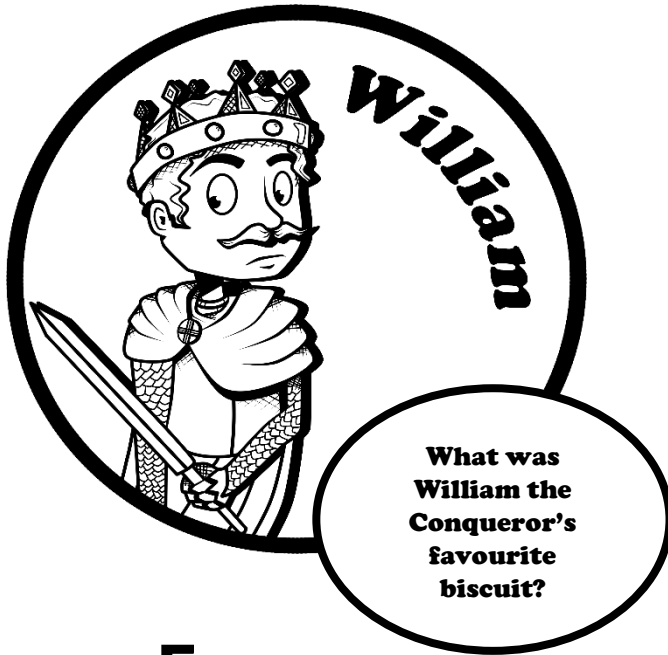
Can you spot a tiny tin of biscuits? What kind are they?

Head upstairs to the Bayeux Tapestry Gallery



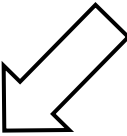
In Scene 39, there is a man baking biscuits and cakes for William's men- can you see him? What were the biscuits baked in?



*Now head up to the Silchester Gallery on the Second Floor*

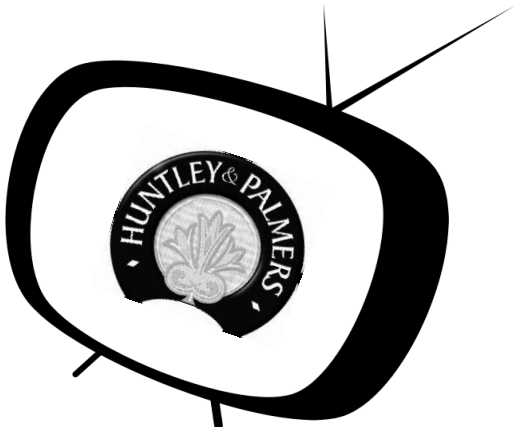
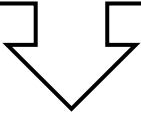
Riddle me this-I am a spice whose name is all in a jumble. The Romans used me to make tasty cakes and biscuits. Lift me and give me a smell. What am I?

There is a biscuit hiding in this gallery. Can you spot it in a corner by a pillar?

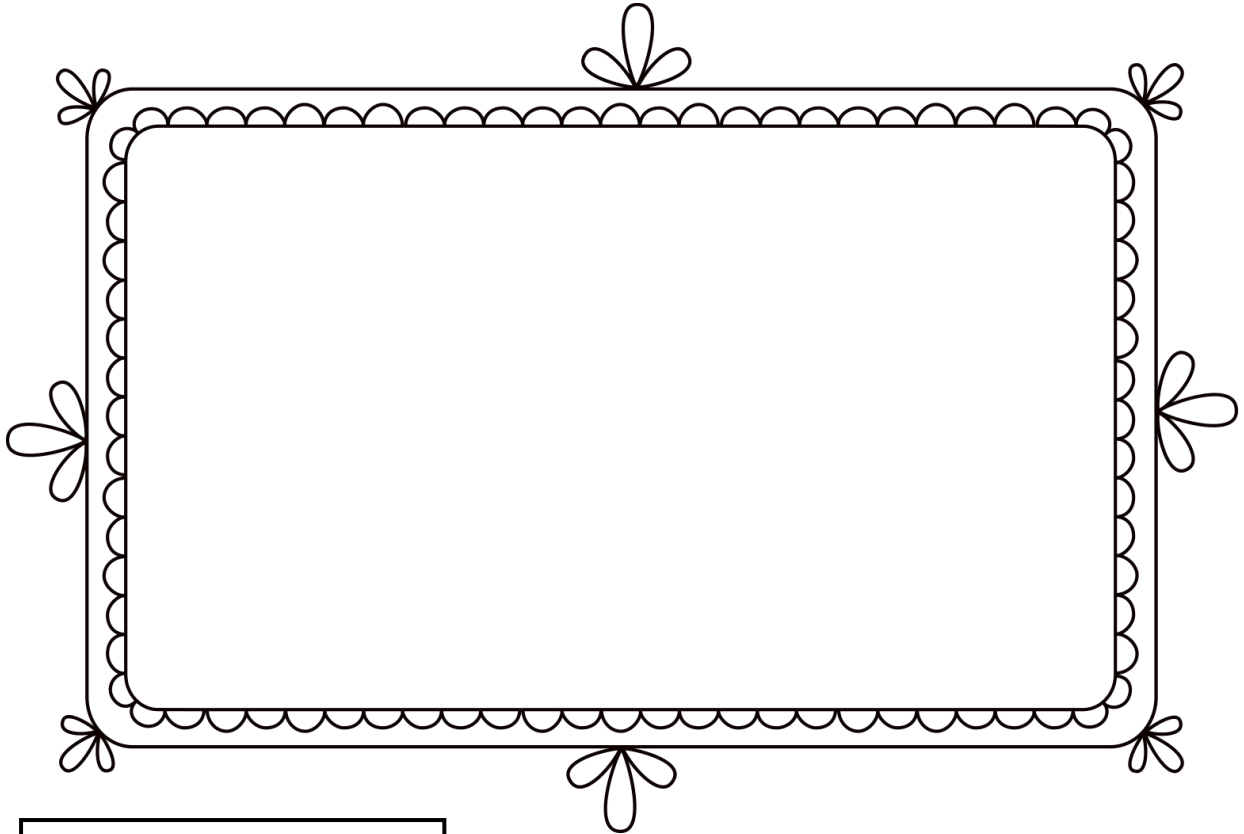


**Walk through the Atrium and Greenspace to reach the Huntley and Palmers Gallery. Take a seat and have a break to watch some films about biscuit factories**

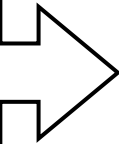
If you look to your left what is the boy chasing? Did you know this was Huntley & Palmers' bestseller?



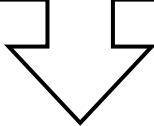
**Look inside the big book of biscuit designs. Design your own dream biscuit!**



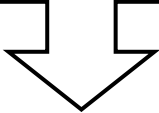
Look for the strange machine that turns with a big metal handle. What was it used for?
